A WORD FROM THE RECTOR

Have you seen the Repair Shop, on BBC TV?



I wasn't convinced at first, but I must admit you get drawn in. Objects which are damaged, degraded or unserviceable, but with a personal and often affecting story, are brought into the Repair Shop where a team of specialists, each a person of skill in their own discipline, individually and together bring the object back to life. Otherwise the alternative is for the owner to dispose of them, or leave them languishing in the attic or garage, or to do a DIY repair (which often leads back to option one; disposing of it!) When the object has been fully restored, the owner comes back to see and collect the finished work and is amazed, delighted and often moved to tears by the transformation. It has come back to life and the story – and the person connected with it – has come back to life too. It is not a new object. It bares between the paint or veneer evidence of the cracks and damage now repaired. It also bares new marks and flourishes of the craftspeople who have worked on it. In such a way Christ came as the Maker's craftsman, to repair human lives, and the world at large. In doing so he was wounded and broken, and when he was restored to life the marks of those wounds remained present but even more evident was his transformed glory. And he offered and offers just such a transformation to hearts and lives today. *Continued on Page 2....*

As we seek to repair our communities and our society, we need each other; the skills and vision and persistence we can each contribute, to re-knit those parts of life that have become frayed, or torn, or wounded, no less than we need nurses and doctors and other key workers to care for our physical wellbeing. Part of achieving this will be to comprehend that the story of this period of our lives will be forever written into us, and that is no bad thing. It is important to carry and tell our story; even if some parts hurt, or are less creditable, so that we can fully understand, and can better care for one another. As we emerge from this reshaped life, which looks in many ways like the old life, but is subtly and radically different, we have the opportunity to recognise those new elements which will enhance the way we interact: the way we see the world and one another.
